

CT scan of the blood vessels in the body or the limbs

Computed tomography scan (CT) can be used to examine the structure and illnesses of the blood vessels.

Blood vessels include veins and arteries.

Computed tomography scan can be used to examine the structure and illnesses of the blood vessels.

Computed tomography uses X-rays to take cross-section images.

Please reserve approximately 1 hour for your visit.

The examination usually takes 15 minutes.

Patients who need urgent examinations may be examined before you.

Please see the arrival instructions or appointment letter for contact information, if you have any questions about the examination.

Before the examination

- You may eat and drink normally.
- You may take your prescribed medication as usual.
- If you are hypersensitive to iodinated contrast medium, please inform the doctor who referred you to this examination as soon as possible.
- If you are pregnant or suspect that you are pregnant, please inform the doctor who referred you to this examination as soon as possible.
- If you have a sensor that monitors interstitial fluid glucose, it can usually remain in place for the scan.

However, please be prepared to remove the sensor if needed.

Bring a new sensor with you, just in case.



During the examination

During the examination, you will lie on your back on an examination table.

The examination table will move during the scan.

It is important that you remain still during the scan because movement causes blurred images.

A radiographer will insert a cannula into your blood vessel.

The contrast medium will be administered to the cannula.

The contrast agent will make the blood vessels more visible in the scan.

The contrast medium may cause a warm sensation in your body.

You may also sense a metallic or foul taste in your mouth.

These sensations will pass quickly.

After the examination

You will receive the results of the examination from the doctor who treats you.

If you do not know how to find out the results, please contact the outpatient clinic or ward that referred you to this examination.

Other things to note

You will not be charged for the examination separately.

Cancel the appointment if you cannot come. If you do not cancel, you will be charged a fine.
